English Language Proficiency Requirement					

OIS is required to collect evidence that J-1 exchange visitors have sufficient English language

proficiency to fully participate in their proposed activities.



J-1 scholars can waive out of taking an English language proficiency test if:

- they are a citizen of one of the countries listed below;
- they have earned a university degree in the U.S. or one of the countries listed below; or
- they are currently enrolled or have earned a degree in a program of study where English is the primary language of instruction.

If the scholar does not meet one of the exemption criteria, they are required to provide test scores from a standardized English language proficiency test recognized by UMB. The scores must meet the minimum identified and not be more than two years old. Required documentation for each English language proficiency criteria is provided below.

#### **CITIZENSHIP**

#### **EDUCATION**

Scholars who have earned a degree from an accredited institution of higher education from one of the countries listed above or from an accredited institution in the United States.

Required Documentation: Copy of Diploma



Scholars who have earned a degree from a program of study where English is the primary language of instruction (even if the country is not listed above).

#### **Required Documentation:**

 Document from school's registration office that confirms your degree was conferred <u>AND</u> that English is the primary language of instruction of either the school or the program of study.

- OR -

Scholars who are <u>currently enrolled</u> in a degree program where English is the primary language of instruction.

**Required Documentation**: Letter on letterhead from academic institution where scholar is enrolled that:

- Describes the writer's familiarity with the exchange visitor's English language ability,
- Attests that English is the primary language of instruction of the school or program of study, <u>AND</u>
- Provides supporting documentation about the school that demonstrates recognition
  of its degrees and its authority to operate under the education laws of the country
  where it is located.

#### STANDARDIZED ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST SCORES

**Required Documentation:** Score report from one of the following tests demonstrating achievement of the minimum score or above for that test **AND** demonstrates that test was taken within the past two years.

- <u>Duolingo English Test</u> minimum score of 115 [make scores available to University of Maryland, Baltimore – Graduate]
- <u>TOEFL iBT</u> minimum of 80 on internet-based test; minimum of 550 on paper-based test.
- <u>IELTS</u> minimum of 7.0 total bandwidth

Scholars who do not currently have one of the above qualifications are encouraged to take the Duolingo English Test, which is low-cost and easily accessible online.



## **Funding Requirement**

We are required to verify that all scholars demonstrate sufficient funding to support themselves, and if applicable their families, while living in the United States. The below amounts are subject to change.

- For the J-1 principal, \$37,200/year or \$3,100/month
- If you plan to bring your spouse in J-2 status, you will need to demonstrate an additional \$12,600/year or \$1,050/month
- If you plan to bring one or more children under age 21 in J-2 status, you will need to demonstrate an additional \$8,100/year per child or \$675/month per child

If you are not going to receive a salary from UMB or your UMB salary is insufficient to cover the estimated living expenses for you and your family, you will need to upload funding documentation.

#### **Funding Documentation may include:**

A letter of sponsorship from your government, employer, scholarship organization, etc
on their letterhead, and/or
A bank statement, translated into English, which clearly identifies the currency and the
current balance of the bank account.

# **Dependent Information**

A Dependent is a spouse or unmarried child under the age of 21 who is in the US with a family member in a primary status. You will need to complete a "Request DS-2019 for Spouse or Child" e-form for each dependent for whom you wish to obtain a J-2 DS-2019.
