Innovations Associated with the University of Maryland, Baltimore



UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, BALTIMORE (UMB)

1812 First university established on the foundation of a private medical college

First state-chartered university in Baltimore

1813 Medical library opens. It is believed to be the first library in the country associated with a medical school.

1831 First undergraduate division — "liberal arts" — of the University of Maryland

1870 First dormitories built for University of Maryland students

1880 First incorporated university alumni association in Maryland

1961 First urban campus in the U.S. to serve the professions of law, health science, and social welfare

1982 First academic health sciences library, the Health Sciences and Human Services Library, (HSHSL), to implement the Integrated Library System

1983 First academic health sciences library (HSHSL) in Maryland to become a Regional Medical Library under a National Library of Medicine, Network of the National Library of Medicine grant

1984 First academic health sciences library authorized to upgrade cataloging records in the Online Computer Library Center (OCLC) national database

1992 First institution in University System of Maryland to offer the Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) training program

1994 First recreation department (URecFit) in the University System of Maryland to provide memberships to the partners of LGBTQ+ students, faculty, and staff

2015 First National Cancer Institute-funded Continuing Umbrella of Research Experiences (CURE) program to recruit middle school students to the STEM pipeline program

2018 First university in Maryland to launch a Police Athletic/ Activities League program for children in West Baltimore

2020 Partnered with the University of Maryland, Baltimore County to become the first universities in Maryland to join the Age-Friendly University Global Network

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

1819 First lectures on dentistry in U.S., delivered by Horace Henry Hayden, co-founder of the School of Dentistry (UMSOD)

1839 First dental journal, The American Journal of Dental Science, established, with UMSOD cofounder Chapin A. Harris playing a major role in its organization

1840 First dental school in the world, representing the first effort to offer institutional dental education to those anticipating the practice of dentistry

1841 First Doctor of Dental Surgery degree awarded

1863 First interdental splint made of vulcanized rubber, pioneered by an alumnus and used successfully to treat jaw fractures during the Civil War

1877 First hydraulic dental chair, patented by a faculty member who also went on to invent the air turbine drill

1950 First telecast of a dental operation, transmitted from a UMSOD operating room

1970 First baccalaureate program in dental hygiene in Maryland

1980 First resin-bonded bridge, the Maryland Bridge, developed by faculty members

1982 First U.S. dental school to offer an advanced education in general dentistry program









First U.S. dental school to establish a division of dental informatics to incorporate computers into dental education

First and only dental school to offer a dual-degree BS/MS clinical dental hygiene leader track program

First U.S. dental school to establish a division of artificial intelligence research

SCHOOL OF GRADUATE STUDIES

First program in Maryland to provide academic training for those interested in leading organizational diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts

FRANCIS KING CAREY SCHOOL OF LAW

First law school in Maryland, created when David Hoffman persuades the state legislature to found a law institute at the University of Maryland, where instruction begins in 1824

First African American woman to practice law in Maryland, alumna Juanita Jackson Mitchell

First Black woman to hold a Maryland Circuit Court judgeship, alumna Mabel Houze Hubbard

First law and social work services program of its kind is launched, with law and social work students providing pro bono services.

First U.S. law school with a curricular program on the impact of gender in the legal profession

First female chief judge of Maryland's Court of Appeals, alumna Mary Ellen Barbera

First and only U.S. law school to offer a certificate for Juris Doctor students in cybersecurity and crisis management/homeland security

First forensic defense clinic in a law school in U.S.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

First removal of an ovary by laparotomy

First to predict the relationship between insects and disease

First medical school in the United States to build its own hospital for clinical instruction

First successful removal of a uterine cervix in U.S. or Great Britain

First treatise on eve disease in U.S.

First course in U.S. on hygiene or preventive medicine

First textbook on preventive medicine

First systematic monograph on febrile illness in U.S.

First U.S. medical school to require anatomical dissection

First application of exfoliative biopsy to diagnose cancer

First use of a microscope to diagnose cancer

First report of scleroderma in U.S.

First confirmation that electrical stimulation of the human cortex on one side stimulates muscles on the opposite side of the body

First treatise on leprosy in Baltimore

First experimentally induced case of yellow fever

First description of histoplasmosis

First catheterization of renal and hepatic veins in humans

First successful specific antibiotic treatment of Rocky Mountain spotted fever

First convincing publication establishing the relationship of cancer and smoking cigarettes









First clinical report of a low-dose insulin regimen to treat diabetic ketoacidosis

First shock trauma unit in U.S.

Discovery of CoA Transferase deficiency, a disease affecting the central nervous system in children

First demonstration that E. coli could cause diarrhea in humans by more than mechanism

Development of a microwave scalpel to inhibit bleeding during critical operations

First test of a genetically engineered cholera vaccine

First beta interferon to alter the course of multiple sclerosis

Development of Copolymer1 for mild to moderate forms of multiple sclerosis

First two surgical procedures to treat severe diffuse emphysema

First implantation in Maryland of an electrical device, the vagus nerve stimulator, to help control epileptic seizures in people not helped by medication

1999 First successful blood cleansing procedure to enable people on kidney dialysis to receive a kidney transplant without immediate rejection

2000 First edible vaccine, in the form of a genetically engineered potato, to deliver protection against E. coli

First genetic biomarker for earlier diagnosis of cancer of the esophagus that may lead to more effective treatment

First test of the safety of a new, genetically engineered vaccine for anthrax

2004 First to discover that parts of the brain can be trained to take over damaged areas and that a specialized rehabilitation program for stroke patients that involves repetitive, simultaneous movement of both arms activates new pathways in the brain

First aromatase inhibitors developed, adding a new class of drugs widely used to treat breast cancer

First to discover that a medication used to treat mild Alzheimer's disease can be used to protect people against the toxic effects of nerve agents and certain insecticides

First small artificial lung device, allowing patients to remain active while awaiting a lung transplant

First device, the GammaPod, that can eliminate traditional surgery and radiation for women with early-stage breast cancer

First robotically assisted, minimally invasive aortic valve bypass surgery in the world

First proton treatment center in the Baltimore-Washington, D.C., area begins construction

First and only medical school in U.S. to be appointed by the World Health Organization to begin initial testing of Ebola vaccine

First clinical trials for a potential HIV vaccine

First medical school to take part in a worldwide Zika vaccine trial

First to develop a novel hypothermia treatment with the potential to improve survival chances for the most seriously injured trauma victims

First clinical trial using stem cells to treat babies born with serious heart defects

First to use unmanned aircraft (drone) to transport a kidney for human organ transplantation

First in Maryland to begin clinical trials for the top COVID-19 mRNA vaccine candidates (Pfizer and Moderna)







2021 First to perform 1 million COVID-19 tests for the state of Maryland

2022 First successful pig heart-to-human xenotransplantation

2024 First community "health village" planned to be built at Mondawmin Mall in West Baltimore

SCHOOL OF NURSING

1889 First nursing program at a U.S. public university, under the direction of a graduate of the Nightingale Training School for Nurses

1952 First nursing school in Maryland to offer a baccalaureate program

1955 First nursing school in Maryland to offer a master's program

1964 First nursing school to provide a baccalaureate program for the U.S. Army through the establishment of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Nursing

1979 One of the first nursing schools in U.S. to offer a PhD program

1980 First graduate nursing program to offer a nationally accredited major in nursinghealth policy studies

1988 First nursing school in the world to offer a master's specialty in nursing informatics

1991 First nursing school in U.S. to offer a PhD program with a nursing informatics concentration

1999 First and only nursing school in Maryland with a museum designed as a learning environment for students

2001 First nursing school in Maryland to offer an RN-BSN online degree program

2002 First nursing school in U.S. to offer an environmental health nursing graduate certificate program

2003 First nursing school in U.S. to offer an environmental health nursing track in its master's program

2004 First nursing school in Maryland to offer a master's specialty in nurse anesthesia

First and only nursing school in Maryland with an institute for educators

2005 First nursing school in Maryland to offer a doctor of nursing practice degree

First nursing school in Maryland to offer a clinical nurse leader (CNL) master's option

2006 First nursing school in U.S. to receive a grant from the Susan G. Komen for the Cure to advance education and practice in the treatment of breast cancer

2008 First nursing school in Maryland to offer a combined adult nurse practitioner and gerontological nurse practitioner master's specialty

2016 First nursing school to earn the American Association of Colleges of Nursing's Innovation in Professional Nursing Award twice (also recognized in 2010)

First nursing school in Maryland to offer a care coordination with health IT focus area (as part of its RN-to-BSN Program)

2020 First-of-its-kind clinical nurse leader guaranteed seat partnership with the University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC), through which the School of Nursing provides UMBC students who meet the criteria with guaranteed admission to its Master of Science in Nursing CNL option

2021 Only nursing school in U.S. to offer a graduate certificate in substance use and addictions nursing

2022 First nursing school in U.S. to establish an organized research center, the Placebo Beyond Opinions Center, to advance interdisciplinary research and education on placebo, nocebo, and expectation effects

2023 First nursing school in Maryland to pilot a faculty residency program designed to prepare nurses for faculty roles







2024 First nursing school in U.S. to launch a restorative justice student leadership program, through which nursing students receive training to become restorative justice facilitators

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

1844 First formally appointed pharmacy professor in U.S., David Stewart

1852 First meeting of the American Pharmacists Association, the largest U.S. professional pharmacists association, organized with the help of School of Pharmacy (UMSOP) faculty

1871 First laboratory for instruction in analytical chemistry in a college of pharmacy, established by William Simon

1883 First pharmaceutical laboratory at a U.S. school of pharmacy, established by faculty member Charles Caspari

1898 First president of the National Association of Retail Druggists, now called the National Community Pharmacists Association, faculty member H.P. Hynson

1910 First Food and Drug Administration (FDA) commissioner for Maryland appointed, Dean Charles Caspari **1927** First-of-its-kind department of pharmacology and therapeutics, established through a gift from Isaac E. Emerson of the Emerson Drug Company

1930 First research fellowship in pharmaceutical chemistry, sponsored by faculty member and graduate H.A.B. Dunning

1948 First female dean of a pharmacy school in U.S., B. Olive Cole (acting dean)

1972 First U.S. pharmacy school to participate in the FDA's drug defect program, which allows pharmacists and other health professionals to uncover problems related to the quality of pharmaceutical products

1978 First two pharmacists elected to the prestigious Institute of Medicine, a unit of the National Academy of Sciences, includes Dean William J. Kinnard

1980 First and only center for the study of pharmacy and therapeutics in the elderly, now known as the Peter Lamy Center on Drug Therapy and Aging

1983 First school of pharmacy to take over pharmacy services in state mental health facilities

1997 First palliative care pharmacy residency program in the world

2006 First organized research center at UMB, the Center for Nanomedicine and Cellular Delivery, now called the Bioand Nano-technology Center

2011 First two FDA-funded Centers of Excellence in Regulatory Science and Innovation, established in collaboration with the University of Maryland, College Park

2012 First-of-its-kind MS in pharmacometrics program

2013 First school of pharmacy included in the Waters Corp. Centers of Innovation Program, in recognition of UMSOP's Mass Spectrometry Center

First disease-agnostic infrastructure for patient-centered outcomes research, created by the PATIENTS Program with a \$5 million grant from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality

2017 First pharmacy school in U.S. to implement pharmapreneurism — pharmacy entrepreneurism — into its strategic plan and to incorporate the initiative into its education, research, practice, and community service goals

First MS in palliative care online program in U.S.

2019 First graduate program in U.S. dedicated to the study of medical cannabis







2021 First PhD in palliative care program in U.S.

SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

1961 First graduate school of social work in Maryland

1964 First school in U.S. to have a Volunteers in Service to America fellows program

First school of social work to make it possible for hearing-impaired students to earn a Master of Social Work (MSW) degree through its Center for the Graduate Social Work Education for the Hearing Impaired

1965 First U.S. training center to focus on poverty and problems within the inner city

1968 First school in U.S. to establish a communications center for the families and friends of those affected by civil unrest after the death of Martin Luther King Jr.

1969 First intercampus social work program in U.S. (UMB and the University of Maryland, Baltimore County)

1970 First school in U.S. to offer both MSW and Master of Clinical Psychology degrees

First school in social work education to organize content into specializations or concentrations

1979 First school in U.S. to offer a post-master's certificate in social administration and first to offer a clinical/social administration concentration

First school in U.S. to offer a certificate of concentration on aging and to offer an aging administration program to meet the critical need for qualified personnel in the network of agencies and organizations — emanating from the Older Americans Act — to serve the growing population of older people

1980 First and largest MSW specialization program in the world focused on employee assistance programs

2008 First program in U.S., the Financial Social Work Initiative, to help prepare social work students, faculty, staff, and the broader field to better address financial realities in people's lives and within the social work profession

2009 First school of social work to host a Public Allies (AmeriCorps) program

2013 First school of social work to host a federally recognized Promise Neighborhood

2014 First center in U.S. dedicated to evidence-based practice in child welfare

2020 First school of social work in the Delaware/Maryland/ Washington, D.C., region to form a dedicated office of diversity, equity and inclusion with an associate dean and full-time staff

First diversity, equity, and inclusion training institute within a school of social work, the LEAD (Leading for Equity, Anti-Racism, and Diversity) Institute

2023 First school in U.S. to offer the dual-degree MSW and medical cannabis science and therapeutics post-baccalaureate certificate

2024 First school of social work in U.S. to host a justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion summit in response to the closing of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) offices and the increase in anti-DEI legislation around the nation

First workplace-focused opioid response program in U.S., formed in partnership with the School of Medicine
